***Winters Police Partners with Yolo County for Live911***

Yolo County is bringing Live911 (<https://live911.com/>) to Yolo County. This technology allows officers/supervisors in the field to monitor 911 calls received by YECA (dispatch) on their vehicle MDC's so they have real-time information and situational awareness. Winters PD is receiving one license for the program. The program will be installed in the supervisors' vehicle. If deemed to be of great value to WPD, we may expand to more vehicles in the future.

***Take Part in the Yolo County Mental Health Services Act Community Survey***

As you may recall, Yolo County passed the Mental Health Services Act which is a 1% tax on income over \$1 million to expand community mental health services. Last year, they developed a three year spending plan for those funds and now they are seeking input from communities via an anonymous survey. ***Public Workshop Planned for Discussion of Cannabis***

On February 27<sup>th</sup>, the City Council and Planning Commission will meet in a joint session to conduct a public workshop on the cannabis industry. The city has hired HDL and Companies to present the current state of the cannabis industry in California and a review of options the City may consider should they allow any cannabis industry within its limits. HDL will also be able to answer questions from the council, commission, and community members during the workshop based on their large body of work for other municipalities and counties in the cannabis area. This will be a workshop only; no action will be taken at the meeting. Its purpose is to share information and receive input from the community.

I attended the first one in January, and it was great fun chatting with everyone in a casual setting (and not in a formal meeting).
